

Logical Consequences Restitution, Restoration, Restriction, Reflection

	Definition	Characteristics	Sample
Restitution	You broke it, you fix it Opportunity to fix a problem behavior has caused	 Related to behavior Student initiated Requires action Individual or group May include reflection 	Someone says something to hurt someone's feelings. Student purposely knocks over another student's books.
Restoration	Opportunity to regain composure/self- control	 Temporary Removed from situation Non-punitive Individual or group May include reflection 	A student goes to the TAB area to regain composure after becoming frustrated during group work.
Restriction	Temporary loss of a privilege the student abused	 Temporary Related to behavior Individual or group May include reflection 	A student misuses supplies, so supplies are removed from that student for awhile. A student is moved away from the seat next to a friend after continuing to talk with the friend during silent work time.
Reflection	Student problem solving	 May be independent May be facilitated by another adult or student Individual or group Focused on future behavior 	A private social conference with a student following repeated disruptive behaviors.
