

Logical Consequences Restitution, Restoration, Restriction, Reflection

	Definition	Characteristics	Sample
Restitution	You broke it, you fix it Opportunity to fix a problem behavior has caused	<ul> <li>Related to behavior</li> <li>Student initiated</li> <li>Requires action</li> <li>Individual or group</li> <li>May include reflection</li> </ul>	Someone says something to hurt someone's feelings. Student purposely knocks over another student's books.
Restoration	Opportunity to regain composure/self- control	<ul> <li>Temporary</li> <li>Removed from situation</li> <li>Non-punitive</li> <li>Individual or group</li> <li>May include reflection</li> </ul>	A student goes to the TAB area to regain composure after becoming frustrated during group work.
Restriction	Temporary loss of a privilege the student abused	<ul> <li>Temporary</li> <li>Related to behavior</li> <li>Individual or group</li> <li>May include reflection</li> </ul>	A student misuses supplies, so supplies are removed from that student for awhile. A student is moved away from the seat next to a friend after continuing to talk with the friend during silent work time.
Reflection	Student problem solving	<ul> <li>May be independent</li> <li>May be facilitated by another adult or student</li> <li>Individual or group</li> <li>Focused on future behavior</li> </ul>	A private social conference with a student following repeated disruptive behaviors.
